# Bridging the Disconnect – overcoming Seniors' Loneliness.

The Symposium was held on 30<sup>th</sup> April 2019. Around 90 members attended the Symposium. The talk on overcoming loneliness was followed with 4 break-up groups to recap, reflect and to share on the related topic.

**Polling results**: Using a polling device to analysis the profile of the audience, here are some of the results: 75% live with their family, have a wide circle of close friends and relatives. Above 80% have a positive image of themselves and their loved ones and understand that loneliness is dependent on their relationship with others. Majority agrees that loneliness is a public health issue, and a challenge faced by our society. 51% of the audience polled are above 60 years old and 25% above 70, with female forming 85%.
